BOARD NOTES

Board Meeting Notes from the December 8, 2016 Meeting Carol Kincaid

Finance VP Dan Anderson stated that we have raised approximately \$131,000 for our "Raise the Roof" project but reiterated that we still have a long way to go to pay off our total expenses which came to about \$300,000 for the new roof, trusses and other construction. He estimates that we need at least another \$125,000 to pay off our bank Line-of -Credit (\$100,00) and to restore our reserves to a healthy level (\$25,000). So there will be another appeal to all of us members as well as the general public and foundations for additional donations.

Our website has a new look and is easier than ever to use. Check it out.

Sally Hines, our VP of Publicity is looking for some member(s) who would like to work on using more of the social media, such Twitter and Instagram, to help with marketing and publicity. If you have an interest and knowledge in this area and might like to work on this, please contact Sally.

The DPAL Open House on Saturday December 3 was a great success. Dick Blick provided 2 demonstrators who were here for 6 hours and our league member Margaret Buchholz demonstrated water-color techniques. Besides enjoying refreshments and trying out new art supplies, the raffle of 4 baskets provided by Dick Blick, Carlsons and Bob Greene (Dupage Framing) brought in \$300 for our Roof Fund. We would like to repeat this next December when Wheaton holds its Wheaton Holiday Walk since it was great exposure for us and we had a lot of traffic and sales.

The sale of "Melted Snowman" has been very successful. More than 88 have been sold as of December 8 and more sales are expected. However, revenue from Yuletide Treasures is down from last year because we have less stock this year.

The Activities Booklet will be out soon and Yvonne Thompson is planning something on the front cover to celebrate the league's 60 years—its Diamond Jubilee

Sandy Wille, VP of Activities, stated that our monthly Monday evening programs will be held at the annex.

“The roof is fixed, but our finances aren’t” Dan Anderson, VP Finance

That’s the message we shared with members in our recent mailing. We got the roof to stop collapsing and leaking by borrowing money from a bank. For some mystical reason, the bank says they want their money back ... with interest ... in about a year. So we are still in fund raising mode. What’s wonderful is that some 220 members, foundations and businesses have already contributed over \$131,000, putting us more than half way home. The DPAL Board wants to thank all of you for helping us cope with this extraordinary crisis, allowing us to keep a roof over our heads and to continue giving DuPage County artists a place where they can develop their skills and exhibit their work.

SCOUTING FOR VOLUNTEERS – ANOTHER FEEL-GOOD WAY TO HELP DPAL IN THE NEW YEAR

For several years now, Carol Kincaid and Cele Gerber have been the A-Team in introducing local Scout troops and elementary students to the wonders of the Art League and the artwork of our members. Kids arrive with wide eyes and tons of questions. An hour and a half later, they leave with big smiles on little faces, their original work of art, and a fondness for the Art League. And their moms, dads and teachers have a new appreciation for our organization, too.

This program’s popularity has grown to the point of about a dozen visits between January and May, and we are in desperate need of an AA-Team. Would you be willing to observe our goings-on sometime in January or February and see if it’s something you could help us do for the League? The kids are eager and we think you’ll find it to be fun as well as most gratifying. The scheduling of dates is flexible enough to fit your own calendar.

Here’s the general set-up: The kids come bustling in around 4:00 and we divide them into two groups of (usually) about ten. Carol takes them into a classroom to sketch a still life with bright colors while Cele asks them to find and talk about one of their favorite pieces in the current exhibit. In both activities, kids often have amazingly insightful things to say about the use of shape, color, line, and other elements.

The fledgling artists switch places after a half hour, and at the end of both sessions, we post and discuss their completed work. They are back out the door before 5:30. The A-Team (and soon-to-be AA Team) then slaps a High Five for another successful afternoon of community outreach at the League!
