Our next Zoom program will feature... Watercolorist Michael Ireland Monday, September 21, 6:30-8:30PM




For all of my life, I've been an avid reader. I thought it might be fun to throw out some titles, both fiction and nonfiction, in case you are looking for a good read with an art theme.


