Determined efforts by instructors and students have kept the Art League free of the coronavirus as we inch toward resuming our main mission, bringing quality art instruction to our members and other interested parties. Kathy Szeszol, our VP Education, wants to continue with the winning formula through the end of this calendar year to build on our successful track record. We will be offering more classes, while continuing to limit on-site classes to a maximum of six students to allow for social distancing. At the same time, we have moved well along our learning curve with respect to on-line instruction, principally with Zoom offerings. The feedback from students regarding these online classes has been positive, but we plan to do systematic surveys to learn ways to do even better.

Meanwhile, the other important part of our mission, that of giving our members opportunities to exhibit and sell their art while also getting expert advice from judges, is almost back to normal. Of course, the new normal means that we must limit the number of people who can be in our galleries at any one time. This mostly affects our ability to host receptions for members exhibiting in Gallery Two, which is unfortunate. Gallery One has an extensive display of very nice pieces of art. If you haven't been in the Art League lately, you are encouraged to come see, and be inspired by, this display.

We are two or three volunteers short of the number we need to staff the front desk on the old pre-pandemic schedule. If you can spare four hours a week to do something important for the success of our Art League, while also having a surprising amount of fun greeting people and helping them sign up for classes, please drop us an email or phone the Art League to find out more about how you can volunteer. And there are other opportunities for volunteering what with our upcoming Yuletide Treasures exhibit which requires many hands to get set up. We look forward to hearing from you.

Janet Kloss, "Spring at Sandy Bluff," Acrylic Resounds with luminosity. Color in the shadows glow with the use of violet and green. Captures the essence of time and sense of light, movement and unique sparkle of an imminent

Theme Award

Kathy Manning, "The Window Box," Watercolor Strong entry into a common metaphor for autumn, pumpkins, made unique by editing pulling the viewer into the textures, surfaces and rich color. Great contrast and presence.

Special Merit Awards

M. Kent Goebel, "Starting Over," Oil Romantic visual statement of a memory the hope in gardening offers. Great use of color and strong depiction of the elements from the shed. The repetition of red is compelling, luscious.

Dale Olsen, "Summer Sunlight 2," Oil Excellent use of depth created by atmospheric perspective. The rhythm of trees, so stable, yet with enough variety that it pulls attention to the dance of the forest. This is the contrast "felt' in the specific season.

Cathy Raef-Dunnigan, "Schist Window," Color Pencil There is a charming sense of a place, as in a folk tale, an anticipation of the window being opened to reveal a narrative. Excellent use of texture, value. It is believable without being too transparent, leaving the viewer to wonder about this window and its inhabitants.

If your piece is already framed under glass, you can put on the floor of a room with natural light, and take a photo aiming your camera down on it. This eliminates the glare. The drop off dates are Wednesday and Thursday, September 23 and 24, between 10AM and 2PM. And you can enter online only due to COVID-19, and they will be judged in the same show. Just let me know when you email so we know. Remember to bring a face mask to enter the gallery. Pick-up: October 21-22, 2020.

Board Notes

 Activities VP Sue Thomas is working on the best way to film videos for the upcoming fall programs. She recently held a trial run with Ellen Rottsolk and



one of the tech people at the Wheaton Library who volunteered to help. It looks like all will be well when the season's first program debuts in September.

- The league incurred some additional costs recently for the plexiglass shield at the front desk, a new safe and a new printer. In spite of that, although total cash on hand was down slightly, we are in sound shape.
- We've had trouble with the exhaust fan in the large classroom but Chuck Showalter, VP Building and Grounds, recently discovered the problem and it's now working. He's also in the process of getting bids on some HVAC work.
- Kathy Szeszlol, VP Education, recently held a teacher's meeting attended by 18 teachers. A good part of the meeting was devoted to talking about safety and sanitation, a concern for everyone during this pandemic. The Zoom classes have been going well as have the sessions at the art league which are limited to six students at a time and are socially distanced. Kathy has begun work on the winter schedule which will have four sessions of four weeks each with a week off in between each session.
- The league is going to go ahead with our annual Yuletide Treasures show. Yvonne Thompson, our Business Manager, said she received a resounding "yes" from the past participants she contacted to ask whether we should hold it. Suffice it to say, Yvonne has been using all her creative brain cells to come up with ways to make this work. While it will be smaller than usual, she promises it will be "welcoming and invitina."
- The POS system project is still ongoing. Yvonne has put in many hours entering data and says while she won't predict exactly when it will be up and running but it's getting closer. We've determined that we will need a few more staffers at the front desk if we want to expand the hours we're open. Now is a great time to join because everyone will soon be trained on the new system at the same time. According to Yvonne, it will make the job much easier.

As they say, the first year is the hardest, and for certain the League has had its ups and downs, but through the efforts of some dedicated members, it has survived and there is now every reason to believe that it will be an integral part of the cultural life of DuPage County forever.
