Letter from the president, Dan Anderson

Too many times I have promised in this column that the Art League's new website and point of sale system is just around the corner. But things are looking very positive now. Yvonne Thompson is in the process of arranging training for front desk volunteers on how to use the new point of sale system and she provided a colorful demonstration of the system at our last Board of Directors' meeting. So, there is good reason to assume that the end truly is in sight.

One of the most exciting aspects of this technological breakthrough is that our website should allow people to register for classes online. Yes, one could argue that we should have been there several years ago, but a volunteer-driven organization doesn't always move at the fastest pace. We're still struggling with how to handle gift certificates purchased at the Art League, but we may put that offering on the back burner for another month or two while we move ahead with the rest of it. However, since there is a lot of lead time needed in setting up class schedules, the online registration option may not be available until we are offering summer classes.

And speaking of classes, it appears that government stipulated COVID restrictions are going to be relaxed in the near future. At the Art League we intend to continue being vigilant and conservative in our own approach, but we do anticipate being able to offer somewhat larger classes and more classes very soon. Meanwhile, please do your part to hasten our progress and help keep the Art League as safe as possible by getting vaccinated at your first opportunity.

Gallery I – March 2021: Flowers on the Wall

Entry: February 24-25 | Pick-up: March 24-25

Flowers on the Wall should inspire you to create art that will bring spring into your step. Remember, it doesn't have to be a wall hanging. It can include fused glass, sculpture, ceramics, jewelry, textile and fiber art, wallpaper design, etc. This exhibit will be judged by Tony Armendariz. Please drop off at DuPage Art League on Tuesday and Wednesday, between 9AM and 5PM. If you are able, take a picture of your piece and email it to Margaret Bucholz at Margbucholz@comcast.net by February 24. They will be put into a virtual slide presentation for posting on the website. Virtual as well as in-house, has brought customers into the gallery to shop and buy art.

If any of you are still feeling uncomfortable coming into the art league to drop off your artwork due to COVID-19, you can email me a digital of your entries with title, media, size, and price and I can print and mat your entry to put on a section of a wall reserved for online entries only.

Each member artist may exhibit two pieces per month free of charge. A non-member pays \$10. The second piece must be priced at \$125 or less and not exceed 25" inside frame dimensions (11x14). If a piece of artwork is sold, the member donates 25 percent of the sale price back to the league. Sales tax is the responsibility of the artists.

Board Notes

February 11, 2021

 Treasurer Pat Thorson reported that our income from classes for the fiscal year through the end of January was approximately



43% of what we would normally see for the six sessions that the league has been open during the coronavirus pandemic. We are also lagging somewhat in membership renewals and gallery sales.

- Sue Thomas reported that the online programs are going well.
 Last month 116 people signed up for the program and 138
 actually attended. There continue to be challenges with the
 online videos but overall we are reaching a lot of people.
- Kathy Szeszol, VP of Education, is already working on a summer schedule. This is a challenging time because we don't know when we will be able to get back to full capacity. We have been releasing one session at a time because we have not been sure that we wouldn't have to close based on the spike in cases. Now that the numbers are going down, hopefully that's behind us. We will continue to offer some Zoom classes even after we are completely open.
- Misty Alvis, our VP of Publicity and Promotion is working on several different promotions including the City of Wheaton's Women's Walking Tour and the month long celebration the city is holding with during the month of June dedicated to artist Frida Kahlo. The Art League will participate in both.
- Mary Lynn Sullivan who is in charge of Gallery II has put together a very thorough and helpful information piece for artists who exhibit in the gallery. The handout gives all kind of detailed information on hanging the show and holding a reception. It covers everything an exhibitor needs to know..
- Sue Jurkus, Membership VP, said that renewals are down but it's still early in the year. Reminders will go out to people who have not renewed at the end of the month.
- Business Manager Yvonne Thompson is working to make the new computer system "staffer friendly" so it is easy to use. She showed the board screenshots of the pages and the board gave it very good reviews.

Turner, Judy MacLeod, Danielle Crilly, Cathy Dunnigan, and Marilyn Karim painted one side of eight raised garden beds in a patriotic theme to commemorate Gold Star Families.

Flanked by red and white stripes, a gold star sits in the middle of a purple circle. A bronze plaque with a fallen soldier's name will be placed in the middle of the star. One bed, with the name of PFC Gunnar Hotchkin and planted with a dwarf cherry tree, will serve as a reminder for residents of DuPage County of the sacrifice made by the Hotchin family. This bed will be unveiled on Memorial Day at Woodridge Village Hall and will be streamed and on Zoom for the public to view. The Home Depot and Obama Legacy Initiative are hosting this

The other seven beds will be painted by local artists to illustrate the theme of orchards and will be displayed at Naper Settlement. The garden beds will be purchased and donated to local organizations that honor and recognize Gold Star families. I greatly appreciated the use of the classroom space at the Art League to accommodate the painting of the Gold Star part of this project.

It is with much sadness that we have learned of the passing of long time life member Alice Elizabeth (Fulsom) Phillips

Alice joined the Dupage Art League in its infancy in the 1960's. When not meeting her DPAL friends or enjoying art, Alice was a lobbyist in Springfield. Her political and social contacts brought recognition and financial support to the Art League. One of the many things she orchestrated was a 4th of July Parade. Illinois Third House, the association of registered lobbyists, and is the only woman to serve in that capacity for over 60 years. Alice served on the Board of Directors of the DuPage Children's Museum and was a Director of Chicago Area Public Affairs Group. She was founder and past president of the Illinois Lincoln Excellence in Public Service Series, a leadership-training program for Republican women. Even up to a few weeks



before she died she was making phone calls reminding people to vote. I remember Alice telling me once that women had to fight for the right to vote in this country and so we should never take that for granted. When I told her I was becoming a US citizen for just that reason she told me "Good from you! I don't even care who you vote for, just VOTE! Women who choose not to vote are slapping the faces of all those who women before us who never had that luxury!

When Alice retired in 2009 she settled in Nomokis, Florida where she acquired a bachelors in fine arts at Ringling College of Art & Design and practiced her love of photography

We have set up a memorial fund for anyone who wishes to remember Alice in a special way.
