
The New Computer System is Live!

Those of you who have shared an email address with us have already been notified of this long awaited news, but for the members who get their newsletter mailed to them this maybe the first time you have heard. Hooray! Yes we are finally live!

You won't be able to sign up for classes online just yet, but you can at least set up your password if you think you would like to use this online feature in the future. Of course you do need to have an email address to make an online purchase...just like Amazon!

So to set up your password go to <u>dupageartleague.org</u> and click on the login button which is just under the shopping cart on the far right, top of the screen. It looks like this:



The next page to open is where you can enter your information, but if this is your first time you will have to set up your password, so click on "Lost Password"

Do not click on the "Register" button. As a member you are already in the system. Any email you have given us will be your username. If we have no email for you, you can enter it when you go to lost password. A link will be sent to your email address and by following that you can set up your password. If at any time you forget it, you can just repeat the lost password steps again. This is in the center of the page and looks like this:

If you are not sure if you have signed up for a class (when the summer classes start), you can check your account from any computer or smart phone. Your accounts are so secure that the staffers no longer have access to your purchase history. For your convenience we have set up a kiosk in Gallery 1 so you can access your account when you are at the Art League.

You can do other things on the new website. You can change how you receive your newsletter, pay your membership and even make a donation. The teachers also will have all your contact info when you sign up for their class and like you, they will be able to access it from home. We are so fancy now! :0)

If you are having trouble accessing your account, ask one of the staffers or contact me for help.



the impact of Covid19. However, gift shop and gallery sales continue to improve. Gallery year-to-date sales are actually higher than this time last year.

- The new computer system, which is set to begin use in a few days, requires the staff to enter transactions in a different order in order to apply discounts on classes. In order to provide the best service to our members a "work around" was developed to handle this issue if it is a problem.
- DPAL continues to add members. Sixteen new members joined last month.
- Sue Thomas, who heads up Activities, reported that last month 74 people registered for Ben Calvert's program and 49 attended. Villa St. Benedict sent the Wheaton library a nice letter saying how much residents enjoyed attending these programs. In the fall the plan is to try to do a hybrid of in-person programs that are still also available via video.
- Misty Alvis, Publicity and Promotion, reported that eight pieces of art were sold during the Women's Art Exhibition. Everyone agreed she did an outstanding job with this year's exhibit and it was a great opportunity to get publicity outside our own building. Misty also said that a big thank you should go out to Liesl Mann for fixing the chalkboard that stands by the front door and also for doing such a beautiful job in writing the message on it.
- Margaret Bucholz reported that last month's show had 46 participants with a total of 67 entries. She had a question about whether the price restriction on a second item could be raised from \$125 to \$200. The board agreed with that suggestion. Invitations have gone out to volunteers for the June Volunteer show. The show will not be judged.
- Yvonne Thompson said that reconciling sales at the end of the day is much easier on the new system. She has created manuals for the staffers working on the new system that should make the transition much easier. Everyone has been trained and the new system is set to go live at the front desk on Monday, April 12.
