Thanks to Dan, the DPAL 2019-2020 board, and our loyal teachers; the DPAL still continues to offer art instruction and appreciation to our community.

We wish to thank our members who have filled available spaces in classes and who have patiently waited for class sizes to increase so they may rejoin the classes they love. We applaud our teachers who bravely continued to teach classes throughout much of the pandemic before a vaccine was even on the horizon. Social distancing, cleaning hands, and mask wearing continues to prevent our having to shut our doors.

Note: We have increased the price allowance on the second piece of art to \$200 in hopes of getting more members to exhibit their artwork. Each member artist may exhibit two pieces per month free of charge. A non-member pays \$10. The second piece must be priced at \$200 or less and not exceed 25" inside frame dimensions (11x14). If a piece of artwork is sold, the member donates 25 percent of the sale price back to the league. Sales tax is the responsibility of the artists.

Signing up Online for Classes...Well Almost!

We are getting closer and closer to being able to sign up online! While we still have the limited class numbers because of COVID, you will still have to sign up through the front desk. Once we are back to our normal class capacity, I see no obstacles to stop you doing online registration, if you wish.

It has always been our plan to offer you a choice for how you sign up, but the online system can't distinguish between members and non-members. While the class capacity is only six in the small classroom and eight in the large one, we want our members to still have the privilege of a few days advanced booking, before the general public, and at the moment that can only be done at the front desk.

Just a few things to note. You do need an email address to do online registration. If you get your newsletter via email you are already registered on the site, you will just have to set your password.

Here's how that is done. Go to our website at <u>dupageartleague.org</u> and in the upper right corner you will see a little shopping cart with "Login" under it. Click on that. The next window you will see under the Login box is "Register" and "Lost your password". Click "Lost your password", NOT register. On the next screen, enter your email address and click "Reset Password". A link to reset it will be sent to your email address, just like when you forget your Amazon password!

- Pat Thorson, our outgoing Treasurer reported that considering the unusual year we had because of the pandemic we have done well holding down expenses to balance our loss of income from class revenues. Projecting a budget for next year was extremely difficult. All in all, we still have money in reserve and it looks like things will be opening up sooner rather than later. It is apparent that we are going to have to look for ways to save money, however. We may have to cover the cost of a bookkeeper or accountant and we will have costs for support for our new POS system.
- Much of the board discussion was around opening classes. Things keep changing and we know we will have to be flexible. We are determined to put our students' health above everything so we are going to err on the cautious side. Our Education VP Kathy Szeszol also reported that more teachers will be coming back this summer and there will be more classes for young people.
- There is a lot of excitement about June when the Frida Kahlo exhibit at COD kicks off and the Downtown Wheaton Association and the DuPage Art League are celebrating the exhibit. Friday Nights downtown are going to be very lively. The rumor is there may be strolling Mariachis. The store fronts will be decorated. 
