Entry: August 25-26 | Pick-up: September 22-23

We are trying to get back to normal in Gallery 1, so you no longer need to send in your digital image. Just encourage all your friends, family and coworkers to visit the DuPage Art League so they can see wonderful art by local artists. Only winning pieces will be posted on the website.

Each member artist may exhibit two pieces per month free of charge. A non-member pays \$10. The second piece must be priced at \$200 or less and not exceed 25" inside frame dimensions (11x14). If a piece of artwork is sold, the member donates 25 percent of the sale price back to the league. Sales tax is the responsibility of the artists.

This show will be judged by Charles Heinrich, and ribbons and cash prizes will be awarded.

October 2021 – Paint DuPage (Community Invitational) All members enter for free, but community of artists outside of our membership can enter for a fee of \$10.



A graduate of the University of Illinois with a Bachelors in the Teaching of English and a Masters degree in Secondary Guidance and Counseling, I taught English and counseled students in the Glenbard District 87 system for 34 years. After retiring, I was able to pursue my lifelong interest in art.

As a resident of Wheaton since 1976, I was familiar with the DuPage Art League and began taking art classes there in 2002. After studying drawing and experimenting with various mediums, I found I best express myself using soft pastels. I have been fortunate to study with several outstanding local pastel teachers at the league. Additionally, I have attended numerous pastel workshops with internationally known pastelists. In June of 2017, as a member of the Chicago Pastel Painters, I attended the International Association of Pastel Societies Convention in Albuquerque, NM. I have won many awards for my pastels which have been shown at the DuPage Art League, the Naperville Art Walk, the Discovery Museum of Lake County, Gallery Seven in Lockport, the Alliance of Fine Arts 'Best of the Best' Show, and the Chicago Pastel Painters Members' Show.

My subjects vary but are primarily landscapes, often from rural areas. Barns, which are fast disappearing from the Midwest, become the focal point of many of my paintings. Other landscape themes result from plein air painting or from my travels. I seek to convey a mood, a glimpse of rural America, or an immersion in nature.



We are concerned about what will happen in the future with our arant which is in question since the death of Richard Driehaus.
- Sue Thomas reported that we will be starting our monthly programs in September which will continue to be on-line. September's artist is Don Yang and our own Danielle Crilly will be his model. Marge Hall will be featured in October.
- Margaret Bucholz said that since the gallery is now open, we will only be posting the photos of the winners on-line beginning in September.
- Misty Alvis reported that DPAL has 68 paintings displayed at Mayslake in Oak Brook. There will be a reception on September 25 from 10 to 12PM.
- Carol Kincaid raised the issue of our annual meeting, and the board has agreed we should hold it in October. Stay tuned for more information.
