Dear Members,

Learning to love our KPI's.

This past month, the Board discussed how we begin to measure the success of our various strategic plan objectives over the next three years.

If you are not familiar with the term KPI's, it stands for **Key Performance Indicators**. These are targets we track to understand progress toward a goal.

In your daily life, you may use KPI's to track the number of steps you take each day,or the growth of your 401k. Schools use KPI's to determine if their students are reaching expected standards for their age and grade level. These results are frequently conveyed by graphs of one sort or another. KPI's help us assess progress.

All kinds of data can be tracked, but what makes sense in our situation? We have five Strategic Goals, so we'll want to watch our growth in these areas—Growing Membership, Increasing Revenue, Improving Efficiency, Increasing Member Involvement and Outreach.

More specifically, we may decide to measure the breakout of students by art medium—how many students take drawing classes and how many take watercolor classes. Knowing this information might then inform us on whether we need to increase the number of instructors in one medium or another.

We certainly will want to track the number of attendees at the various free public programs that we offer throughout the year. This is an important part of our Mission and Vision and we take pride in this outreach to the community.

As the months go on, we'll be gathering data and creating the bar graphs and circle graphs that will show us how we are doing. Assembling these and reviewing them will be both interesting and informative. When we get this process up and running, I'm sure we will find ways to share these with you. We make these efforts to ensure the strength and vitality of our organization and to make sure that our members enjoy and thrive through our programs, classes and friendships.




The DuPage Art League is excited to exhibit the artwork of Susan Mclean in Gallery II.
