
Dear Members.

Winning Art with judge's comments

Best of Show: Joanna Asianian

Insomnia, Oil "Insomnia" sparked an immediate reaction in me as a viewer. Stark, high contrast and immediate, the

painting reflects an intense feeling of resignation to the constancy of the nightly visitor. The lights and darks push the figure forward in the picture plane. The viewer is confronted as well. L A highly effective interpretation of the theme ala "Munch."






Best of Theme: Roberta Tassara Degas' Balerinas, Oil "Degas' Ballerinas" captures essential elements of a Degas work of art, particularly the diagonal format which was so revolutionary when the artist introduced the format in the 1870s. The piece presents a nice looseness, communicating the expression of the dancer's figures.



Special Merit: Jan Kloss Meow Meow Matisse, Acrylics

Matisse would be proud! This acrylic painting presents a delightful scene of tranquility for the moment. The intensity of the cat's stare foreshadows a possible upset for the goldfish. I love that the painting made me think of what might happen next. Technically a good handling from the detailed fish.



Special Merit: Barb Finn Stranger in a Stranger Land, Pastel

This pastel portrait draws the viewer into the image by eliminating background detail. Exhibiting technical proficiency, the piece goes beyond technique and confronts us with questions. Who is he, where does he come from, what has happened to him? A satisfying piece of art handled with facility.



Special Merit: Mooneen Maurad Impressionism Floral, Acrylics

Pop! Here I am! This abstracted floral piece demands attention from the viewer. I really enjoyed the artist's playful use of contrasting color and loose handling of the paint. A delightful painting to grace a wall and gives happy ... to all who view its vibrancy.


