# **Board Meeting Notes - May**

#### Treasurer's Report: Financial Activity:

Total income for the fiscal year was more than budget due to higher than budget in membership, gallery sales, summer classes open studio, donations and interest from government securities. This difference is net of lower than budget artist's sales (gift ship and Yuletide.) class revenue for fall sessions A and B, and for winter sessions B and C.

Total expenses for the fiscal year were less than budget due to lower than budget in artists' payments, cost of classes and workshop instructors. This difference is net of higher than budget in artist payments-gallery sales, repair and maintenance expenses and depreciation expense (non-cash; due to new furnace, AC and air cleaner purchase installed on 4.25.25. Jennifer went over the budget for fiscal year 2026. The budget was approved by the Board.

Membership Report: We currently have 418 members.

Buildings and Grounds: Mark Galli reported the new furnace and air conditioner were installed. He has been working on the sign for the back of he building.

# **DPAL Board Volunteer Position**

The DuPage Art League is seeking a Treasurer. The ideal candidate will have accounting and finance experience and a working, basic knowledge of QuickBooks and Excel. An understanding of nonprofit accounting is helpful, but not necessary. This person must hold honesty and integrity in high esteem and be committed to accuracy, transparency and timeliness.

Responsibilities include recommending financial policies, supervising the bookkeeper, monitoring credit card transactions, processing credit card refunds, overseeing the insurance policies, presenting and preparing monthly financial reports, reconciling bank accounts, executing ACH (direct deposit payments), preparing positive pay bank uploads, downloading sales information, and working with third-party accounting firm to prepare Form 990 (this arrangement will be completed after April 15). Qualifications include strong communication and interpersonal skills, working knowledge of Microsoft applications such as Excel, Word and PowerPoint, attention to detail and accuracy, and business acumen and ability to identify and communicate operating risk.

The time commitment is approximately 4-6 hours per week. The current Treasurer's term ended on April 30, 2025.

#### **ARTS DUPAGE'S "ARTISTIC ALCHEMY" JURIED EXHIBITON:**

Arts DuPage put out a call for art to all artists with a profile on Arts DuPage, with a deadline of April 30. Participants were asked to enter up to 3 pieces and include an artist statement not to exceed 150 words to accompany each entry. Our members. It is free to post an artist profile on Arts DuPage and promote your art and any art activities you are a part of.

The gallery is located in the Wentz Concert Hall and Performing Arts Building, main entrance on Ellsworth. Artist Reception is scheduled for Saturday, June 7, from 2:00-4:00 pm. The exhibition runs June 7 – July 17, 2025.

# Cantigny French Festival Plein Air Exhibit Information

June 30 thru August 3

You do not have to be attending & painting at the festival to submit work for the exhibition. Art should be plein air paintings representing the locations our group has visited. They can be from past seasons. Cantigny would prefer images that depict Cantigny or St. James, but general images of trees, fields, water or such would be fine. (no chicken coops:))

- 2. 1 or 2 pieces per artist. Framed with wire hanger, no saw tooth, the walls are curved.
- 3. Artist's name, contact information, title of painting and price (if for sale) must be securely attached to back of artwork.
- 4. This same information plus painting medium MUST be emailed to Ellen by June 14. Cantigny is printing the signage.
- 5. Paintings MUST be delivered & signed in at the Dupage Art League by June 21. I will have the clipboard with paperwork in back by the teacher's artwork. Leave your pieces in the artwork storage area by the back door of the small classroom. You can begin dropping off paintings next week.
- 6. About the sale of artwork...because of a multitude of complications...Cantigny will not handle the actual sale. They will give contact information to interested parties. They are not asking for any commission, but if there are sales... they wish the art to remain hanging until August 3rd.
- 7. Sue and I will collect the paintings & return them to the league after the 3rd.

# July 14, 2025, 6:30PM - The Essentials of Art Materials

Jaclyn Mednicov will present "The Essentials of Art Materials", a 90-minute handson, free presentation, via Zoom, that focuses on art materials and the relationship between paper surfaces and drawing/painting media. The presentation will empower artists with the knowledge necessary to choose the right papers and art materials for their own artistic practice. Attendees will participate in hands-on exercises using a selection of papers and drawing materials. Which for an amail with instructions for registration. Registration is limited.

The presentation will cover all aspects of art papers including:

- How paper is made on different types of papermaking machines
- The technical aspects of paper (weight, sizing, fibers used, and surface texture.)
- How surface texture and sizing affect the look of your artwork
- How the right paper can work with your drawing and painting techniques
- How to choose the right paper for your artistic practice
- Storing/handling paper and artwork for longevity and permanence

The presentation also covers art materials relevant to the attendees, which may include:

- Graphite
- Charcoal
- Colored Pencil
- Marker
- Water-soluble drawing media
- Watercolor
- Gouache
- Acrylic
- Oil Paint

#### Attendees will receive:

- Selection of Strathmore and Canson papers & literature
- Selection of drawing, painting, and water-soluble materials
- Princeton watercolor brush



#### **About the Presenter**

Jadyn Mednicov is a Chicago based artist, whose work combines painting, photography, collage and installation. She has studied at Parsons School of Design in MYC, University of New South Wates in Sydney, Australia, and has her BFA from University of Kansas and MFA from The School of the Art Institute of Chicago. She has attended residencies at Awagami Factory in Japan, Vermont Studio Center, the Ragdale Foundation, The European Ceramic Work Center, and the SEA Foundation. As the beauty of spring emerges, so do our plein air painters. Be sure your adventure into the world of plein air is safe by taking a few seconds to pack some safety essentials. Better yet, create your own plein air first aid kit. Include this small kit with your other important items for your safe adventure into the world of plein air painting.

#### **Plein Air First Aid Kit**

- 1. Antiseptic / alcohol wipes
- 2. Aspirin
- 3. Adhesive bandages
- 4. Diphenhydramine (Benadryl)
- 5. Insect repellant
- 6. Polysporin antibiotic ointment
- 7. Wet wipes
- 8. Plastic resealable bag
- 9. Triangle bandage
- 10. Safety pins
- 11. Scissors
- 12. Sunscreen
- 13. Tweezers
- 14. Knife
